ITINERARY - PERTH TO BROOME

DAY 1 | Adventure begins in Perth

The tour will officially start with dinner where you will meet your fellow travellers and the KOT crew.

DAY 2 | Perth to Geraldton via Numbung National Park (Pinnacles)

Departing Perth, we stop at Kings Park for stunning views over the Swan River and city. Heading north via the scenic Indian Ocean Drive, we visit the famous Pinnacles in Nambung National Park — a surreal desert of towering limestone formations. After lunch, we pass through the historic towns of Dongara and Greenough, known for their leaning trees, before arriving in Geraldton to enjoy the vibrant foreshore and an overnight stay.

DAY 3 | Geraldton to Kalbarri

Departing Geraldton, we visit the HMAS Sydney Memorial for a moving tribute and panoramic views over the city and Champion Bay. Travelling north, we stop at historic Northampton before visiting the striking Pink Lakes of Port Gregory. Continuing along the dramatic Shipwreck Coast and past the Zuytdorp Cliffs, we arrive in Kalbarri at the mouth of the Murchison River for dinner and an overnight stay.

DAY 4 | Kalbarri to Monkey Mia

This morning we explore Kalbarri National Park, including the spectacular Sky Walk with views over the Murchison River and insights into Nanda culture. We then visit Nature's Window to see the stunning gorges up close. After lunch, we enter the World Heritage-listed Shark Bay, known for its unique wildlife, red sand dunes, and turquoise waters. Enjoy scenic stops along the way before arriving at Monkey Mia for a two-night stay.

DAY 5 | Exploring Shark Bay

Start the day with a stunning sunrise at Disappointment Reach, followed by the famous Monkey Mia dolphin experience. Then enjoy a catamaran cruise in Shark Bay Marine Park, spotting dolphins, dugongs, turtles, and more. After lunch, we visit Denham and the Shark Bay Discovery Centre for insights into local history and First Nations culture. Spend a relaxing afternoon at the resort, with options like swimming, beach walks, or the scenic Wulyibidi Yaninyina trail.

DAY 6 | Shark Bay to Carnarvon

This morning we visit Eagle Bluff for stunning views over Freycinet Inlet, with the chance to spot sharks below. Then it's on to Shell Beach — a striking stretch made entirely of tiny white shells. Continuing north, we arrive in Carnarvon, known for its "upside-down river" that supports lush plantations. We visit the Carnarvon Space & Technology Museum, which played a vital role in the Apollo moon missions.

DAY 7 | Carnarvon to Mount Augustus

Today we leave the coast for the outback, stopping briefly at Gascoyne Junction before visiting Honeycomb Gorge in the Kennedy Range for lunch. Then it's on to Mt Augustus (Burringurrah), the world's largest rock, towering 715m above the plains. We arrive in time for dinner and a well-earned rest.

DAY 8 | A day at Mount Augustus National Park

Today we explore Mt Augustus or Burringurrah as it is known to the Wajarri people. We will complete the 49 km Mt Augustus Loop Drive and make many stops including Cattle Pool, part of the Lyons River. We will do some short, easy hikes through the day. Keep an eye for the red kangaroos, euros and bungarras (perenties). For keen birdwatchers we hope to see spinifex pigeons, crimson chats, sacred kingfishers, blue-winged kookaburras and mulga parrots. At the end of the day we enjoy a sunset drink and barbecue overlooking the rock.

DAY 9 | Mount Augustus to Exmouth

We travel the outback roads back to the coast, exploring the eastern side of Cape Range National Park with its rugged ranges and deep canyons. A highlight is the Charles Knife Canyon drive, offering stunning views over the canyons and Exmouth Gulf. We also visit the historic Wapet Oil Well No. 3 site before arriving in Exmouth for a three-night stay.

DAY 10 | Ningaloo Reef & Cape Range National Park

Today we explore the western side of the Cape Range National Park, driving south along the Ningaloo Coast, the second World Heritage Listed area of our tour. We will drive as far south as Yardie Creek where we take a short walk along Yardie Creek Gorge for spectacular views and hopefully see rock wallabies. After a picnic lunch we will go to Turquoise Bay, one of Australia's top beaches. You can simply enjoy a swim in the shallows or admire the beauty of the crystal clear waters, protected by the fringe reef.



ITINERARY CONTINUED...

DAY 11 | A day of activities around Exmouth

Enjoy a free day in Exmouth to relax or explore. Optional activities (at own cost) include snorkelling, whale shark swims (Mar-Aug), whale watching (Jun-Nov), fishing charters, scenic flights, glass-bottom boat tours, or visiting the aquarium. We're happy to assist with bookings.

DAY 12 | Exmouth to Karijini National Park

Today we journey into the Pilbara, passing the Ashburton River and Hamersley Ranges on our way to the stunning Karijini National Park. We arrive at our luxury accommodation for a well-earned rest and a two-night stay.

DAY 13 | A day of Karijini National Park

Today we explore the wonders of Karijini National Park, visiting Joffre Falls Lookout, Fortescue Falls, and the Visitor Centre. Enjoy walks, stunning lookouts, and the chance to swim in crystal-clear pools for those feeling adventurous.

DAY 14 | Karijini, Millstream National Park & Point Samson

Leaving behind Karijini we have some great stops as we head back to the coast. We make our way through the heart of the Pilbara to Millstream-Chichester National Park. Here we have a break at Deep Reach pool. We continue our journey through historic Roebourne before arriving at Point Samson.

DAY 15 | Karratha's surrounds & Port Hedland

In the morning we set off to explore the Karratha and surrounds. This includes a stop at the restored ghost town of Cossack, the birthplace of WA's pearling industry.

We continue onto Dampier where we visit the Red Dog statue before going to Murujuga National Park on the Burrup Peninsula. This National Heritage Listed site has over 1mln petroglyphs (rock engravings) dating as old as 50,000 years. We then continue our journey north to Port Hedland where we join a Twilight Port Tour to learn more about the port and how important the region is to the Australian economy.

DAY 16 | Port Hedland to Eco Beach

Today will see us leave the Pilbara behind and reach the Kimberley as we head north along the North West Coastal Highway. Along the way we will stop at the southern end of 80 Mile Beach at Cape Keraudren. Here the famous Rabbit Proof Fence once met the ocean. We continue north, skimming the edge of the Great Sandy Desert before reaching Eco Beach in time for a well-earned drink watching the iconic Kimberley Sunset.

DAY 17 | Eco Beach to Broome/Airport

Today our adventure comes to an end as we make the 90 minute drive into Broome where we drop you at the airport or your accommodation.
