Travel the legendary Gibb River Road, visiting highlights including the Prison Boab Tree and Derby, Bandilngan (Windjana Gorge), Dimalurru (Tunnel Creek), Dilmanyi (Bell Gorge), Galvans Gorge, Wunaamin Miliwundi Conservation Park, and El Questro Wilderness Park with a relaxing soak in Zebedee Thermal Springs. Explore Wyndham's Five Rivers Lookout, cruise the Ord River, visit the Durack Homestead Museum and Lake Argyle, and discover the spectacular Purnululu National Park (Bungle Bungle), including Cathedral Gorge, Piccaninny Creek and Echidna Chasm. With a Mimbi Caves Indigenous Cultural Tour and a scenic return via Halls Creek, Fitzroy Crossing and the Napier Range, this may be our shortest Kimberley tour — but every moment is unforgettable.

ITINERARY - BROOME-BROOME

Day 1 | Broome to Wunaamin Miliwundi Conservation Park

We will collect you from your accommodation (time to be advised) and take the highway towards Derby. On the way we will drive through typical boab savannahs, so you will know you are in the Kimberley. We visit the town, including the Prison Boab Tree and the historical jetty before making our way onto the Gibb River Road. We take a walk through the incredible Bandilngan (Windjana Gorge) with the Lennard River flowing, spotting for flora and fauna along the way. Keep an eye open for freshwater crocodiles. Continuing to the Wunaamin Miliwundi Conservation Park, we settle in for our two night stay. [En-suite Safari Tent, Bell Gorge Wilderness Lodge \(B,L,D\)](#)

Day 2 | Day of Dalmanyi (Bell Gorge)

Today is a day of exploring Dalmanyi (Bell Gorge) in the Wunaamin Miliwundi Conservation Park. We take the opportunity to walk and swim in the magical Kimberley gorge. This is what the Gibb River Road is all about! We return back to our accommodation for a relaxing evening. [En-suite Safari Tent, Bell Gorge Wilderness Lodge \(B,L,D\)](#)

Day 3 | Wunaamin Miliwundi (King Leopold Conservation Park) to East Kimberley

An early morning start to continue this adventure as we head to the East Kimberley. We continue along the Gibb River Road with a walk and a swim at the picturesque Galvans Gorge. The journey continues over the Kimberley Plateau and crossing two major rivers; The Durack and The Pentecost. We settle into our accommodation for the night after an adventurous day.

Day 4 | El Questro to Wyndham to Kununurra

A relaxing soak in the thermal waters of Zebedee Springs is a must of any visit to El Questro so after breakfast we make our way here. For lunch we visit the main hub of El Questro 'The Station' to view the township in its glory. Wyndham is our next stop with the Five Rivers Lookout and panoramic views of the Cambridge Gulf. This afternoon we make our way to Kununurra; the largest town in the East Kimberley. Here we visit Ivanhoe Crossing and the Diversion Dam of the Ord River. We have a two night stay in Kununurra.

Day 5 | A Day of Kununurra, Ord River and Lake Argyle

Today we drive out to the Durack Homestead to learn about the history of the family and the challenges of early European pioneers and to view Lake Argyle. Taking a scenic boat cruise along the Ord River to Kununurra. This ecosystem is home to an abundance of bird life with over 300 species in the Kimberley. You will also spot freshwater crocodiles. We will learn about the history and making of Ord River Irrigation system. Along with absorbing a Kimberley sunset before returning to our accommodation after a great day exploring.

Day 6 | Kununurra to Purnululu National Park (Bungle Bungle Range)

Departing Kununurra we make our way to Purnululu National Park. We pass by the indigenous communities of Doon Doon, Warmun and the Carr Boyd Ranges. Venturing back onto the dirt tracks, we take the windy road over the Osmond Range into the World Heritage Area (Purnululu National Park). We enjoy an optional scenic helicopter flight over the Bungle Bungle Massif, admiring the beehive domes in their glory. This flight is not included in your tour and is an extra cost. We enjoy our night under the stars, with a campfire in the park.

ITINERARY - CONTINUED...

Day 7 | Purnululu National Park (Bungle Bungle Range) to Halls Creek

Today is spending the majority of our day exploring Purnululu National Park. We walk into Cathedral Gorge and Piccaninny Creek to view the magnificent striped bee hive domes. Following the Bungles Massif we head to the northern end of the park to walk and explore Echidna Chasm. This narrow path has walls as close as 1m wide and the sandstone gorge towers as much as 200m above. Our Bungles adventure comes to an end as we venture out the park and into Halls Creek for the night.

Day 8 | Halls Creek to Fitzroy Crossing

Halls Creek is known as a former Gold Rush Town. We look at the town before driving through cattle country. We are on the end of the Napier Range where we take an Indigenous Guided Tour of Mimbi Caves. Here we learn about the culture, the history and spectacular geology of the limestone formations. Tonight, we stay on the banks of Martuwarra (Fitzroy River) at Fitzroy Crossing.

Day 9 | Fitzroy Crossing to Broome

Today we have an early start to complete the loop of our adventure. Before making our way to Broome, our last outback adventure is walking through a large tunnel that has been carved through the limestone of the Napier Range, known as Dimalurru (Tunnel Creek). We learn about the deep history of the area and the tragic story of Jandamarra, a Bunuba man who fought a 3 year long resistance against European colonisers. Farewelling the gorges, waterfalls, boabs and cattle stations, we take the highway back to Broome where we will drop you at your accommodation.

Please note: Itineraries may vary slightly by departure including altered directions and the order of activities. All highlights and attractions will be enjoyed on all departures.
